Code of Conduct and Liability Release for Student Impact Basketball

Respect, sportsmanship, and self-control are expected from all players, coaches, and parents/spectators of this league. Participation in this league is a privilege, which will be jeopardized if respect, sportsmanship, and self-control are not exercised.

Liability Release

The undersigned accepts full responsibility for the above-named participant if under the age of 18 and shall release Westfield Washington Schools, Student Impact, Pacers Athletic Center, Grand Park, its coaches, officials, commissioner, and Board of Directors from any liability as a result of injuries a child may incur while participating or playing in any Student Impact Basketball Event. The undersigned accepts total responsibility for the participants safety to and from all practices and games, and while the child is at a league-sponsored event. Parent or guardian acceptance required if participant is less than 18 years of age.

Devotions and Prayer

A brief devotion and prayer will be presented by Student Impact staff, volunteers, or coaches prior to games each week.

Respect

Opponents, players, coaches, captains, and officials will be treated with respect. Accepting the decisions of referees, coaches/captains without criticism is an important value held by this league. No cursing at referees, coaches/captains, or other players.

Our facilities are provided for our use by Pacers Athletic Center and Westfield Washington Schools. We are their guests, and we treat these facilities with the utmost respect. All participants of Student Impact Basketball are expected to dispose of their trash in appropriate trash bins and leave benches and stands clear of debris.

Sportsmanship

This league encourages hard play, but fair play. Good sportsmanship is highly valued by our league, and unsportsmanlike behavior will not be tolerated. We have a zero-tolerance policy for overly aggressive behavior, physical violence, or threats of such. Failure to follow this will result in a review and potential dismissal of the league.

Self-Control

Emotions are a natural part of participation in any sport. Keeping emotions under control is indispensable in basketball and in all of life. Angry outbursts by players, coaches, captains, or spectators will not be tolerated. Participants in this league are

also expected to exercise self-control by not using tobacco, alcohol, or illegal drugs. Evidence of using these substances in the playing area or grounds will be cause of immediate dismissal and will be reported to proper authorities.

Code of Conduct Procedure

League commissioner will review the code of conduct with all coaches/captains. Blatant or repeated violations of the Code of Conduct will result in the loss of privilege of full participation in this league. The League Commissioner, in consultation with the coaches/captains, Board of Directors and Executive Director will determine the severity of penalties assessed for violating the code of conduct. Violations of the Code of Conduct deemed to be slight, will receive proper warning. Subsequent violations will be cause for dismissal from the league. Anyone dismissed from the league for violation of the Code of Conduct, at any time, will forfeit their registration fee.

League Procedures

- 7-10th Grade Boys League may be coached by High School participants with adult supervision by League Commissioner and League Director
- 11-12th Grade Boys League are coached by senior and possibly junior captains
- Girl's league may be coached by High School participants with adult supervision by League Commissioner and League Director
- Games will begin on time; teams must be ready to take the court. Failure to have a full team present at game time will result in a forfeit
- No players will join a team once the draft is complete, unless approved by the League Director
- Games will be played with two, twenty-minute halves with a running clock. Three, one-minute time outs per team are available with the clock stopping during a time out
- Clock will stop during the last two minutes of a game and during overtime periods
- 1st OT will be 3 minutes, if a 2nd OT is required it will be 2 minutes, 3rd OT will be 1 minute
 - IHSAA rules will otherwise be followed
